



HOW TO DOWNLOAD SCOPUS SOURCE LIST FILE ?


1. Go to <https://www.elsevier.com/solutions/scopus/content> and click link “High-quality data”.



2. Click link “Show more +”.



3. Click link “  Download the Source title list ”.


